






March-Kanata Skating Club – 2021/2022 Season Level Requirements

How does it work?

- A skater is credited with points for every test passed in each of the disciplines (FreeSkate Program, FreeSkate Elements, Skills, Artistic and Dance). The number of test points allocated to each test is outlined in the **MKSC Points Allocation Matrix 2021/2022**.
- If a skater wishes to skate on a session for which they do not qualify, a request must be submitted in writing by the Skater's Coach to the STARSkate Director. The request will be evaluated by the Admissions Committee. Priority will be given to skaters qualified to skate on a session.
- If you are unsure of how many points your skater has, please contact the STARSkate Director. A skater is credited with points for every test passed before **June 30, 2021**.
- Ideally the MKSC Points system will remain constant, however we may adjust the session requirements each year depending on anticipated registration levels.

13 to 20 Points	<i>Equivalent to all STAR 2 tests completed. *</i>	
		
INTERMEDIATE 1		
21 to 38 Points	<i>Equivalent to all STAR 3 tests completed. *</i>	
		
INTERMEDIATE 2		
39 to 56 Points	<i>Equivalent to all STAR 5 tests completed. *</i>	
		
SENIOR 1		
57 to 113 Points	<i>Equivalent to all STAR 6 tests completed. *</i>	
		
SENIOR 2		
114+ Points	<i>Equivalent to all STAR 9 tests completed. *</i>	

*Dance music played during sessions will be at/above STAR level indicated unless coach requests.

**Skaters MAY NOT request music during a session.
